

Qualitative Data Analysis with ATLAS.ti 8 Windows: Support Included

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Requirements: It is required to use either the demo or the full version of ATLAS.ti 8 Windows when taking this course. No prior knowledge of ATLAS.ti is required.

Methodology: The structure of the course is as follows:

- Ten sections

- Each section includes a summary and a quiz
